### About the British speakers:

**Kirstie Blair** is a Professor in English at the University of Stirling, where she teaches Victorian and twentieth-century literature and children's literature. She has published two books on nineteenth-century poetry, *Victorian Poetry and the Culture of the Heart* (OUP, 2006) and *Form and Faith in Victorian Poetry and Religion* (OUP, 2012) and numerous articles and book chapters on nineteenth and twentieth-century literature.

**James Purdon** is Research Fellow in English at Jesus College, Cambridge. He studied at Cambridge and Harvard Universities, and worked as a parliamentary reporter and a book reviewer before taking his doctorate. James works on nineteenth and twentieth-century British literature, and writes regularly on literature and visual art for several newspapers and magazines. His first book, *Modernist Informatics*, will be published by Oxford University Press next year.

**Jonathan Miles** studied English at London (where the novelist, A.S.Byatt was one of his tutors), at Oxford, Yale and UCLA. He has taught in universities across the world; Paris has been his home for the last twenty years. He has published three books on David Jones, the modernist writer and artist; a work of history and art criticism, *Medusa: The Shipwreck, The Scandal, The Masterpiece*; and most

recently, *The Nine Lives of Otto Katz* – about the Czech anti-Nazi propagandist. *Otto Katz*, like *Medusa* has been translated into several languages and a Russian edition is forthcoming.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE**
